ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

On April 1, 2008, the Administrative Hearings Division (hereinafter, AHD) issued a Compensation Order granting in part and denying in part the claim for relief from Gerard Rorie (hereinafter, claimant). Claimant's claim for permanent total disability benefits was denied. Claimant's alternative claim for temporary total disability benefits from February 1, 2007 to the present and continuing and authorization to treat with a pain management specialist was granted.

On August 22, 2008, Claimant filed a Motion for Penalties for Late Payment of Compensation Due Under An Order pursuant to D.C. Code § 32-1515(f). Claimant alleges that Guardsmark, Inc./ AIG Claim Services (hereinafter employer) paid Claimant after April 22, 2008, more than 10 days after the time allowed to pay compensation due under a Compensation Order.

Employer is hereby **ORDERED** to show cause why Claimant should not be awarded penalties under § 32-1515(f). Employer's response must be filed within fifteen (15) days of issuance of this Order with a copy served upon Claimant. Failure to file a timely response will result in the issuance of an order granting the relief requested.
