MEETING NOTES:

Kenny Diggs and Ella Faulkner introduced the project, explaining the Play DC Initiative, the anticipated process and timeline, and brief overview of the project background to date. Ella walked through the existing site plan highlighting areas that will be part of the scope of work, then Kenny opened the floor to questions and input from the community on desires for the space. Following is the record of that input. ANC Commissioner Rebecca Maydak and a representative from Council Member Muriel Bowser's office also offered support for the project.

- No lights after dusk (consult ANC task force)
 - o Appropriate safety lights no glare
 - o Dark Sky
 - What type of lights? Show samples
- Tot lot enlargement
 - Tot lot age appropriate signage
 - Rubberize the ground surfaces
 - o See 39th & Newark for example
- Natural theme
- Adventurous Cabin John as example, zip line, higher slides
- Expand the area for older children
- Keep natural tactile surfaces
- Like Bovior as a good example
- Keep real trees vs. creating shade structures
- Natural surfaces
 - o erosion control,
 - o Rock creeks
- Multi-generational
 - o Adult fitness equipment
- Incorporate stormwater in design, make it playful, eg rain garden, etc.
- Playground should be dog-free possible fencing
- Walking paths maintain and expand
- Vehicular access walkway is creating water and erosion problems
- Access road asphalt alternative
- Balance between open park space and playground equipment
- Erosion frames context restore and maintain park
- Tennis/Basketball area needs to be resurfaced- prefer softer surface
- Working water fountain
- Gates at the tennis court swing too fast danger when windy
- Steps at the tennis court

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- Dangerous
- Kids slide- longer/taller
- Basketball/tennis area year round, multipurpose
 - o Roof
 - o Seniors
 - o Yoga
 - o Weatherize
- Separate uses dog parks and playground
- Kenny: Advance Rec. Center conversation
- Upper field keep grass, trees, and paths- keep open
- Lighting park is dead in winter
 - Selective lighting would allow kids more time to play
 - Maybe light just space between courts
- Upper field multi purpose sport area
 - o Astroturf
- Upper field: now = dirt, mud when raining
- Quesada and Broad Branch maintain open space
- Rec Center is the only place for children whose parents can't pick them up after school
- Heath of older trees assess, maintain, replant
- Restrooms for families
- Responsible use of tennis court lights
- Maintain "open" qualities of the park
- "Rock Creek" theme?

 - Erosion
 - Upper play area artificial turf
 - o Upkeep, replacement of existing walkways
 - o More/expanded play areas
 - o Safety lights

 - o Refurbish gazebo- painted, pointed, repair light
 - o Maintenance
 - o Rec Center upgrade
- Quesada and 33rd @ tennis court
- Current project underway to install permeable paving and rain garden on Quesada adjacent tennis courts
- Natural play spaces and materials
- Risk-based play
- Maintain park
- Appropriate staffing for rec center- engage the kids
- Track resurfacing- softer material but something also ok for bikes
- Artificial surface @ community center is too hot
- Zoysia grass at Upper Field (tough species)
- Interpretive signs
- St. Columbus Park as natural examples
- Limit use of grass areas in rain/wet
 - Let field rest, "self police"
 - o Field usage/rules sign
- Engineered "natural" surface for playground (not just mulch)
- Joint maintenance FOLP, DGS/DPR
