The Department of Employment Services (DOES) respectfully submits this report to the Council of the District of Columbia pursuant to DC Official Code § 32-771, the Department of Employment Services Local Job Training Quarterly Outcome Report of 2012. DOES uses local adult training funds to expand training opportunities for District residents who may not otherwise be eligible for federally-funded programs.

This marks the fifth quarter that DOES has submitted this report to the Council and as you read through the reports you will notice one significant change. This FY2014-Q1 DOES did not include a report for the On-The-Job (OJT) training program. The OJT program is currently not accepting applications for as the program undergoes a thorough review, evaluation, and redesign to better meet the needs of employers and participant. As a result DOES provided the final reporting data for the program in the Local Job Training report that was submitted for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of FY2013.

ITA: An Individual Training Account (ITA) is an account set up on behalf of an adult to pay for training services. The purpose of the ITA is to give program participants maximum choice in selecting a training program. In April 2011, DOES set the amount ceiling for an ITA at \$4,000. ITAs are funded locally and federally. The above data reflects local funding only.

**Number Completed:** The number of completions includes participants who may have started training in a previous quarter but who completed in the current quarter. In addition, the number of participants enrolled in training varies from quarter to quarter due to exiters leaving programs.

Number Enrolled: The number of participants enrolled in training varies from quarter to quarter due to exiters leaving programs.
