DC Code 32-1009.01 (a)(1) As of January 1, 2020, the third-party payroll businesses required pursuant to § 32-1008(a-1) to process payroll for an employer that employs a tipped worker and hotel employers that employ a tipped worker shall submit a quarterly wage report for the preceding calendar quarter to the Mayor no later than 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter.

 - I. How do we fill vacant seats and obtain replacement for DC Council or Mayoral appointments?
 - A. A representative from the Restaurant Association of Metropolitan Washington;
 - B. A representative from the Hotel Association of Washington, D.C.;
 - C. Two representatives, appointed by the Mayor, from District-based organizations that engage in policy or advocacy for tipped workers; and
 - D. Three representatives, appointed by the Chairman of the Council as follows:
 - 1. Two representatives from District-based organizations that engage in policy or advocacy for tipped workers; and

- 2. One representative shall be an employer that employs an employee who is paid in accordance with \S 32-1003(f), but is not part of the restaurant or hotel industry.
- E. The term of office for each representative provided for in subsection (A.), (B), (C), and (D) of this section shall be for 3 years; provided, that the initial term of:
 - 1. One of the representatives appointed by the Mayor from a District-based organization that engages in policy or advocacy for tipped workers and one of the representatives appointed by the Chairman of the Council from a District-based organization that engages in policy or advocacy for tipped workers shall be for 2 years; and
 - 2. One of the representatives appointed by the Mayor from a District-based organization that engages in policy or advocacy for tipped workers and one of the representatives appointed by the Chairman of the Council from a District-based organization that engages in policy or advocacy for tipped workers shall be for one year.
