• Walk in groups whenever you can—there is always safety in numbers.

- Let a family member or friend know your destination and your estimated time of arrival or return.
- Stay in well-lit areas as much as possible. Avoid alleys, vacant lots, wooded areas, and other short-cuts or secluded areas.
- Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. If you have to walk in the street, walk facing traffic.
- Walk confidently, directly, and at a steady pace.
- Always be aware of your surroundings. If you are wearing headphones, make sure you can hear outside noises.
- Never accept rides from strangers.
- Report any suspicious activity or person immediately to the Metropolitan Police Department at 9-1-1.
